

Trinity E.M.S. Sponsors New Scoreboard for Cawley Stadium

Trinity E.M.S. and other businesses in the Lowell community have partnered together to bring a new scoreboard to the Lowell's Edward D. Cawley Memorial Stadium.

In 2015, Lowell's City Council Parks and Recreation Department Subcommittee formed a committee to raise money with the hopes of having a new scoreboard installed in time for fall sports. The new scoreboard was dedicated on July 1, 2016.

"The committee raised about \$35,000 in 24 hours," said John Chemaly, the co-founder of Trinity EMS. "We were all happy to do it for the community."

Cawley Stadium, which received a new track and FieldTurf surface in recent years, is the home field for Lowell High School's football, soccer and lacrosse athletic teams as well as the Lowell Nor'easter of the New England Football League. The 6,000 person capacity stadium was the home of the Boston Cannons of Major League Lacrosse from 2001 until 2003.

Other sponsors who helped raise money for the scoreboard include F. E. Provencher Insurance Agency, Lowell City Manager Kevin Murphy, Lowell Five, O'Donnell Funeral Home, Owl Diner, PrideStar EMS and Laborers Local 429.
