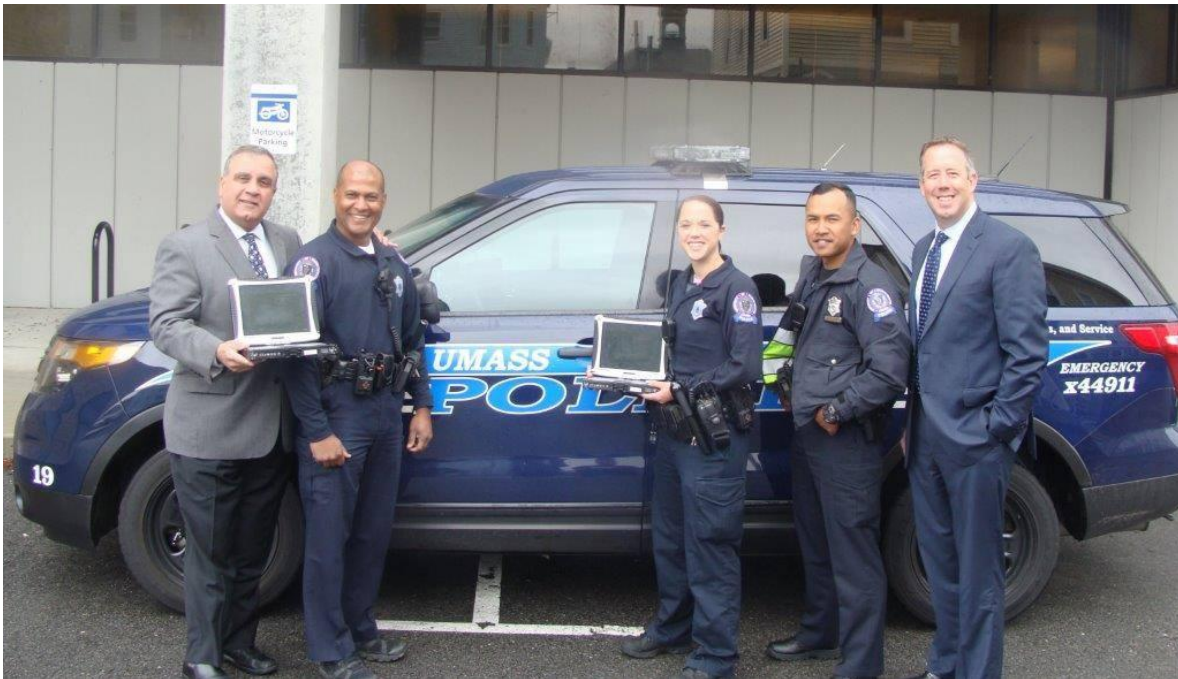


## **Trinity E.M.S. Donates Laptops to UMass Lowell Police Department**
